Citizen input requested for city center

The Portland City Council has directed that a 15-member Citizen Steering Committee be formed to prepare a Central City Plan for the City. The plan will identify a "vision" for the city and provide a guide for public and private development in both downtown and surrounding areas over the next 15-20 years.

Citizens interested in serving on the Steering Committee must submit completed applications by October 1, 1984 to: Central City, c/o Commissioner Strachan, 1220 SW 5th Ave., Room 211, Portland OR

97204. Applications are available from Commissioner Strachan's Office, 248-4151.

Individuals with a history of involvement in community activities and persons with more than one area of community interests are especially sought. Endorsements by community groups will greatly enhance an individual's application. Steering Committee membership is on a volunteer basis and may require several hours per week of your time.

Fifteen seats are to be chosen as follows: representatives of community at-large (4), neighborhood

interests (4), business interests (4), the social service community (1), the cultural community (1) and the design/planning community (1).

The responsibilities of the CSC will be to: 1) manage the planning process, 2) conduct a full citizen involvement process and 3) recom-

mend a draft plan to the City Council. It is anticipated that the planning process will take approximately 2 1/2 years. A pre-planning report adopted by the Council in July, which more fully describes the planning process, is available from Commissioner Strachan's office.

KBOO needs radio trainees

Community Radio KBOO is beginning an intensive four-month non-paid internship program in public radio news production. Five participants will be selected in a competitive application process to take weekly classes and become a working member of the KBOO News Department.

The course of study will cover writing for radio, interviewing technique, voice, story formulation, and radio production. Classes will be held Tuesday mornings between 9:30 and 11:30 a.m. Interns will spend an additional three hours each week working on the daily

newscast. Applicants for the internship program must be able to type and have a broad knowledge of international, national, and local affairs. They will be expected to spend five hours each week on the program.

The Internship program will begin September 18th and run through December 21st.
