ElderCare comes to Oregon

Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon announces the highly successful program ElderCare will be offered in 11 locations throughout the State of Oregon and in Washington during 1984-1985 in association with the Institute for Health Care Education.

Workshops will be conducted by Dr. Ann Blues, Executive Director, Institute for Health Care Education, Inc. She has had 18 years experience in education in the care of the elderly. She is the developer of the ElderCare Program and an author of Hospice

and Palliative Nursing Care.

The training event includes lecture, film, discussion and a panel of persons from local community services, churches and health agencies. A step-by-step guide for developing an ElderCare Program in the local church is included in the training and following the initial workshop, participants whose communities elect to establish an ElderCare Program will receive ongoing assistance from Dr. Blues and the Institute for Health Care Education in the form of monthly resource packets, telephone consultations, on-site visits and program evaluation as structural elements of the year-long program.

A particular feature of the ElderCare Project is its community based orientation. A network of churches, health agencies and social services is established with the goal of keeping older adults healthy, active and independent.

EMO's sponsorship reflects the belief that churches are central to caregiving. Through increased understanding of the processes and needs of aging people, congregations can respond confidently and lovingly to their elders.

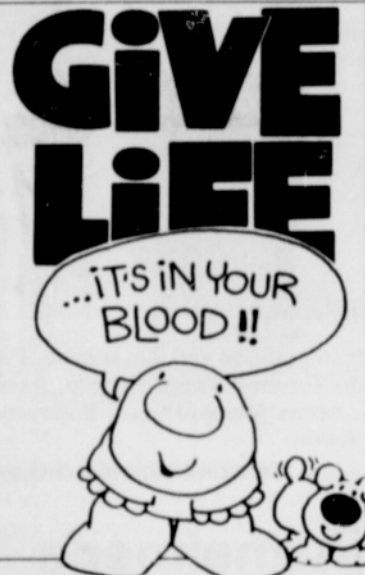

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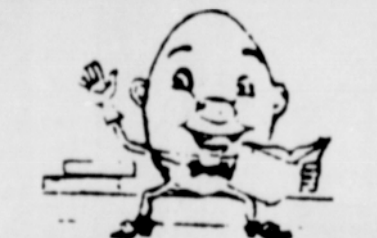

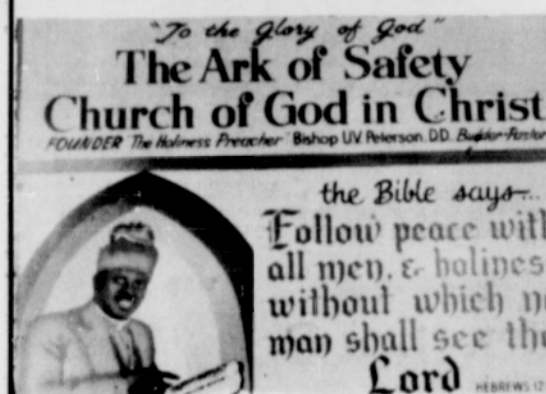
