Contest Closes November 18, 1984

RULES

1. The essay must be entitled: "The Importance of Black Political Action Now!"
2. The essay must be original, not previously published, not secured by copyright.
3. The essay must be between 700 and 750 words long.
4. THREE TYPEWRITTEN Double spaced copies must be submitted.
5. The name and address of the contestant must appear on the first page immediately under the title, submitted in this manner: Subject: _____ An Essay by: _____ Address: _____ High School: _____
6. The manuscript must be post-marked not later than midnight, November 18, 1984 and mailed to: W. Nelson Talbert, Chairman - Omega Psi Phi Essay Contest, Zeta Nu Chapter, 5409 Weatherford Drive, Los Angeles, CA 90008
7. Persons submitting manuscripts thereby grant to the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. the right to keep the manuscript and to exercise full publishing rights to them.
8. Awards will be announced on or about March 15, 1985 and the decisions of the judges will be final.
9. The manuscript must present an adequate treatment of the essay topic.
10. Winners will be required to furnish written proof of enrollment in their respective high schools at the time the essays were submitted.
11. Awards will be submitted to the college to be applied to tuition upon notification that the winner has enrolled.
12. Awards must be claimed within 18 months after the announcement date to be valid.
