Mother of the Year sought

The Oregon Association of American Mothers is beginning its annual search for nominees for Mother of the Year, according to Afton Alder, president of the local association. The organization's chief purpose is to honor women, aged 45 to 75, who have distinguished themselves in humanitarian service in addition to raising families who are a credit to their community. The Oregon Association is an affiliate of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon.

Mothers may not be nominated by their own families, but must be introduced into the program by organizations or churches with whom they have been associated. In the past they have represented the fields of politics, education, business, the media, the arts and volunteer serv-

ice. Applications are available from Gloria Richardson, Search Chair person, P. O. Box 42, Forest Grove, Oregon 97116, and must be completed by February 1, 1985. Rev. Jackson to rejoin PUSH

While he will continue his political activities through the National Rainbow Coalition, the Rev. Jesse Jackson said today that he will return to Operation PUSH.

Rev. Jackson said, "The public economy deals with a \$900 billion annual budget, but the private economy has a \$4 trillion 'budget' (the GNP) — plus five of every six jobs, and all the wealth. We cast our political votes occasionally, once every two years or so; but, as consumers, we cast our economic votes, our dollars, every day. We must never put all of our trust in one lever of liberation (e.g., politics). We must use all that we've got — votes, dollars, marching feet, developed minds, and a morally right cause to liberate ourselves and the nation — and do it continuously."

Rev. Willie Barrow, the Interim National Director of PUSH said, "PUSH is currently looking at a new list of target companies. We are very serious about using Rev. Jackson's increased national political stature to challenge the private economic sector to treat fairly and trade with small, underdeveloped and underutilized minority businesses; to rejuvenate PITB; and continue to build Black, Hispanic and women's economic institutions."
