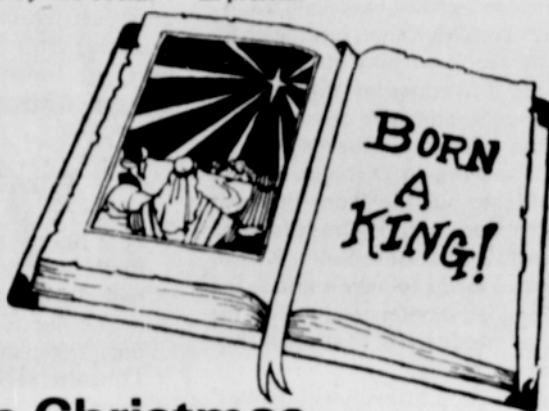
Dinner was served by the social

Churches to aid homeless

A Multnomah County report on emergency shelters for the period of October 29 through November 4, 1984 indicated that

—An average of 339 persons were served on the average night.

—During this period 2,000 men, 266 women and 84 children were served.

—During this period 287 men and 30 women seeking shelter were not able to be served.

The plight of the homeless in Oregon and Southwest Washington demands urgent action and our immediate attention.

In the 25th chapter of Matthew, Jesus tells the story of the last judgment, in which He says, "I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me water, I was a stranger and you received me in your homes, naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me. . . whenever you did this for one of the least important of these my brothers and sisters, you did it for me."

The ongoing plight of the homeless in Oregon has been dramatically called to the attention of the religious community by the approach of winter, continued high unemployment, relationship of the homeless with Rajneeshpuram and ongoing economic distress. Because of these and other conditions, Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon, Catholic Charities and the Jewish Community seek to provide a coordinated interfaith effort by working with local religious and community groups to respond to the urgent and growing statewide plight of the homeless in Oregon and Southwest Washington. We jointly wish to announce that today we have established the Interfaith Committee for the Homeless.

An application screening committee has also been established to receive, review and recommend applicant funding. The first round of funding is scheduled for mid-December. We, therefore, encourage applicants to submit proposals as soon as possible. Per instructions on the application, they must be received by 5:00 p.m., December 14.

To date our efforts in pooling our resources have been quite successful. We, therefore, are encouraging churches and organizations to match these funds being established so that assistance to the homeless can continue throughout the winter.

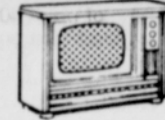
