Resource Service Coordinator

The Regional Research Institute for Human Services at Portland State University is seeking an individual to work as Resource Service Coordinator at a newly established Research and training Center for Improved Services for Seriously Emotionally Disturbed Children and Their Families. The Resource Service Coordinator is a full-time senior position, working independently but under the general supervision of the Center Director. The position includes the following specific duties and responsibilities:

1. Organize a national conference on the topic of improving services for emotionally handicapped children and their families to be held Summer 1985.
2. Coordinate the training activities of the Center and its staff, including the development of training materials and protocols for national distribution.
3. Prepare and issue a quarterly bulletin issued by the Center to be sent to both providers and consumers of children's services in each of the 50 states.
4. Coordinate with the principal investigators to identify information needs, develop training possibilities, and supervise the work of two or more graduate research assistants to seek out, compile, and summarize information needed.
5. Respond as needed to requests for information and technical assistance from funding agencies and other individuals or

organizations seeking to improve services for children with emotional handicaps or disabilities.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. A master's degree in social work (or equivalent degree in the social or behavioral sciences).
2. At least 2 years experience providing child welfare, juvenile justice, or mental health services for children and their families; significant experience developing or working with advocacy organizations and/or self-help groups.
