## Vocal virtuoso sounds off

His voice can move at Mach one speed and shift into an orbital countdown of sounds from screeching tires to the top 40 hit parade. He was introduced in "Cheech and Chong's Next Movie," imitating Jimi Hendrix's guitar solos with his mouth.

He's Michael Winslow, who really makes a name for himself in "Police Academy," where he duplicates the sounds of machine gun fire, squeaky shoes and a video game.

He will give a live performance at the University of Portland Chiles Center Friday, January 25, at 8 p.m. Demonstrating his unique style of "vocalvision," he'll blend acting with the creation of background sounds to further convey the atmosphere of each comedic scenario. "In my act," he says, "I take people on a little movie. If we drive, I select a 'bronco,' a 'bug,' or a 'semi' rig. If we watch television I take my audience through all the channels including stops at 'Fantasy Island' and complete video productions on MTV. There are sounds other people do. My trademark lies in the areas people can't go. I enjoy the monopoly of doing truly original material."

Winslow's appearance at the university is sponsored by the Associated Students of the University of Portland.

The \$5 tickets are on sale at the Chiles Center from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and at GI Joes Ticket Outlets. Remaining tickets will be sold at the door.
