The City Clerk will receive sealed bids until 9:30 a.m., March 14, 1985, for the above project located in Spokane, Washington, in accordance with plans and specifications on file in the office of the Public Works Director, Skywalk Level, Municipal Building, West 080 Spokane Falls Boulevard, Spokane, WA 99201-3343; telephone (509) 456-4300. The bids will be publicly opened and read immediately following in the City Council Chambers. Copies of Plans and Specifications are available at the Public Works Department, upon payment of fifty dollars (\$50.00).

The City of Spokane ensures that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, sex or national origin in consideration for an award. Minority hirings are provided for in contract specifications.

Bids for this project are invited from minority group contractors who have been prequalified; however, all prequalified firms may compete.

Bids shall be submitted on unit price basis on the forms provided, in accordance with the provisions of the specifications; no bids containing unrealistic bid prices will be accepted. Bids are to be filed in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Spokane, and shall be addressed to the City Clerk.

A certified check or surety bond in the sum of 5% of the Total Amount of Bid must accompany the copy of the bid filed with the City Clerk.

No bidder may withdraw his bid after the time set for the opening thereof, unless the award of contract is delayed for a period exceeding sixty (60) days.

Successful bidder shall execute the contract within ten (10) days after the date of award.

The City Council reserves the right to reject any or all bids submitted.

Sealed bids for the Portland International Airport, North Side Remote Aircraft Parking, will be received by the Purchasing Manager of The Port of Portland, 700 N.E. Multnomah Street, Portland, Oregon (mailing address: Post Office Box 3529, Portland, Oregon 97208) until 2:00 p.m., March 20, 1985, and thereafter publicly opened and read.

BIDDERS ARE REQUIRED TO SHOW THAT SUBCONTRACTORS WHICH HAVE BEEN CERTIFIED BY THE PORT OF PORTLAND AS MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (MBEs) WILL PARTICIPATE IN NOT LESS THAN 5 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL DOLLAR AMOUNT BID.

Scope:

Demolition of existing rental car facilities; construction of approximately 39,000 square yards of aircraft parking apron; taxiway overlay; relocation of buried 12.5 KV power line; construction of storm sewers, fencing, and curbs; area lighting; and installation of taxiway lights.

A prebid conference will be held on Wednesday, March 6, 1985, at 10:00 a.m. in Conference Room 3006 on the third floor mezzanine in the terminal Building at Portland International Airport to discuss all phases of the work.

Bids must be on the bid form which will be provided to prospective bidders and must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check drawn on a United States bank or a bid bond payable to The Port of Portland in an amount equal to at least 10 percent of the total amount bid.

Bidders are required to prequalify. Prequalification statements must be received at least 5 days prior to the time set for bid opening. Applications for prequalification may be submitted less than 5 days before bid opening, but consideration by Port cannot be assured.

The drawings and the contract manual may be examined at Port offices. Copies may be obtained by prospective bidders upon deposit of \$10, which deposit will be refunded upon return of the drawings, contract manual, and other documents in good condition within 2 weeks after bid opening.

This is a federal aid contract, and all labor shall be paid no less than the minimum wage rates established by the U.S. Secretary of Labor, as included in the contract documents.

The labor and equal employment opportunity requirements referenced in the Bid will apply to this work. The proposed Contract is under the subject of Executive Order 11246 on Nondiscrimination Under Federal Contracts, September 24, 1965, and as amended; and 49 CFR Part 23, on Participation of Minority Business Enterprise in Department of Transportation Programs, March 31, 1980.

Minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award of any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement.
