

## Conversion act gains speed

Oregonians from around the state will be taking their support for the Oregon Economic Conversion Act (H.B.2722), and several other pieces of essential legislation, to a rally at the State Capitol at noon on Friday, April 5.

H.B.2722, introduced by Rep. Wayne Fawbush (D-Hood River), will levy a surcharge on the cash price received by Oregon companies for the manufacture and sale of nuclear weapons or their components. The monies raised by the surcharge will be used to help companies involved in nuclear weapons manufacturing convert from nuclear-weapons production to more constructive industries.

"Economic conversion is simply planning and providing a way to convert from one industrial activity to another," said Rep. Fawbush. "Our intent is to help direct the resources devoted to unnecessary weapons production into more needed and productive avenues. The components subject to the surcharge under this bill are those whose only function is to contribute to the operation of a nuclear weapon. Generic products, which have multi-uses, will not be affected," stated Fawbush.

The bill is scheduled for a hearing on Wednesday, April 3rd, at 8:30 a.m. in Hearing Room A, of the State Capitol, before the House Revenue Committee.

"The public is encouraged to attend both the hearing on the 3rd and the rally on the 5th," said Fawbush's aide Bruce Lumper. "This bill provides a great vehicle for people concerned about both the nuclear arms race and the economy of Oregon. By showing support for this idea, Oregonians can send their Representatives and Senators a clear message about the industries they want our state to encourage," Lumper said.

This March 21, 1985, thousands of Azanians (Black South Africans), those still home and those in exile, remembered the martyrs of Sharpeville by rededicating themselves to dismantling the reprehensible system responsible for the massacre. Individuals and organizations in the United States can make a similar response by supporting a petition that demands the release of Zeph Mothopeng and all political prisoners in apartheid prisons. In June 1979, racist South Africa held the longest political trial in its history which concluded with the conviction and sentencing of 18 Pan African Congress of Azanian members for activities dating back to 1963. The sentence terms ranged from five to 15 years with one person receiving a commuted sentence. The number one accused in the Bethal Eighteen Trial was veteran organizer Zeph Mothopeng who was sentenced to 30 years for his leadership role in the 1976 Soweto uprisings. Zeph Mothopeng and his 16 co-accused today languish in Robben Island, a notorious maximum security prison. This was Mothopeng's third trip to Robben Island. The first one was for his leadership role in the anti-pass Sharpeville demonstration. Zeph Mothopeng is now 72 years old, and Robben Island guards brutalize him on a regular basis. According to former Robben Islands inmates testifying before the United Nations, the tortures include sadistic beatings, attempted rapes and burying political prisoners in the dirt up to their necks and urinating on their faces! International attention can save Mothopeng's life and the lives of other political prisoners in apartheid South Africa.
