## Tommy Hearns history:

**May 20, 1979 at Las Vegas** — After 18 consecutive victories, Hearns faces his first real test against wily veteran Harold Weston. Weston has Hearns off balance and missing early in the fight but Hearns comes back to damage Weston's eye and the fight is stopped in the sixth round.

**Aug. 2, 1980 at Detroit** — Hearns records one of the most devastating knockouts in recent boxing history with a second-round demolition of defending champion Pipino Cuevas. The knockout brings Hearns the WBA welterweight title.

**April 25, 1981 at Phoenix** — Hearns answers questions about his stamina with a 13th-round TKO of rugged Randy Shields. It is the longest bout of Hearns' career up to this point.

**June 25, 1981 at Houston** — The stage is set for a fall showdown against WBC welterweight champion Sugar Ray Leonard when Hearns clobbers an overmatched Pablo Baez in four rounds. In the co-feature at the Astrodome, Leonard survives a late scare and adds the WBA junior middleweight title by knocking out defending champion Ayub Kalule in the ninth round.

**Sept. 16, 1981 at Las Vegas** — Hearns suffers his only career loss in a classic duel with Leonard for the undisputed world welterweight title. Hearns builds an early lead before Leonard storms back to take control of the fight in the sixth round. Amazingly, Hearns manages to retain control in the 11th round and is ahead on the officials' cards when Leonard rallies to stop him in the 14th.

**Dec. 11, 1981 at Nassau, the Bahamas** — Hearns jumps up to test the junior middleweight ranks, taking an Ernie Singletery. He survives a cut eye to earn a 10-round decision.

**Dec. 3, 1982 at New Orleans** — Hearns wins his second title, taking the WBC super welterweight crown with a majority 12-round decision over defending champion Wilfred Benitez. It is a classic duel of two outstanding boxers and Hearns uses his height and reach advantage to outpoint the smaller Benitez.

**Feb. 11, 1984 at Detroit** — In his first title defense, Hearns wins a unanimous decision over Italy's Luigi Minchillo. It is his third consecutive victory by decision and questions begin to pop up concerning Hearns' punching power at a higher weight.



**June 15, 1984 at Las Vegas** — In shocking, dramatic fashion, Hearns silences his critics with an awesome display of punching power. Hearns twice knocks down Roberto Duran, who had been down only twice in his 81-fight career, before punching him into retirement with a second-round knockout. After the fight, Hearns announces that he is actively seeking a bout against the undisputed world middleweight champion, Marvelous Marvin Hagler.

**Sept. 15, 1984 at Saginaw, Mich.** — Hearns shows that his knockout of Duran was no fluke as he takes out tough Fred Hutchings in just three rounds. A headhunter throughout his career, Hearns shows tremendous power to the body in stopping Hutchings.

What should become the most recognizable marketing symbol in Oregon was unveiled last week by the Oregon Lottery. The Oregon Lottery logo will be the internationally recognized good luck symbol, which is a single hand held up with two crossed fingers. The trademark will be used on outdoor boards, transit advertising, point of purchase signage, and all broadcast and print media. "The Oregon lottery marketing symbol reflects the spirit of fun which will characterize all lottery marketing materials and activities," said Sue Burton, director of marketing. "It also clearly establishes that lottery games are a matter of chance and luck, and not skill." The lottery symbol was developed by Pihas, Schmidt, Westerdahl Company, advertising agency for the lottery commission.
