Tal Mahal at Starry Night


A major highlight of last summer's World Music Festival was the sharing of music between international music ambassador Taj Mahal and Ghanaian-born master drummer Obo Addy. When Taj Mahal's bluesy West Indian electric guitar riffs blended with Obo Addy's African drumming, it took only a moment before the audience was on their feet.


