PSU student needs help for Africa trip

A Portland State University (PSU) student in need of tuition fees, seeks community support. Sharie Smith, a junior majoring in psychology, would like to enroll in PSU's summer studies program going to Kenya, East Africa this summer. The program runs from June 27 to July 29. She would like to "broaden" her knowledge about African culture and her cultural heritage. But the dream to learn from the motherland grows fainter

with each passing day. And with the opportunity becoming bleaker and bleaker, she is asking "churches and community organizations" for help. She needs \$2,200 of the \$2,975 the trip will cost. And she is willing to accept a loan, or tax deductible contributions to help defray the cost. Either way, she said, "I would be grateful. I am honest, and I'll repay whatever anyone loans me." Sharie Smith's story is a sad but familiar one. She comes from a family of

ten brothers and sisters; eight younger than she. And she is working her way through school. But true to the woes of those in need, many opportunities must pass her by. However, Sharie Smith is a fighter; she's willing to work off the debt of tuition — not live off the fat of the land. She said, "My mother and father are not able to help me, and that's why I am making this appeal." Kenya is only one of several countries PSU students will be visiting this summer: Ireland, Israel, Brazil, Mexico and Spain being some of the others, said Demari Wakhunga, the Kenyan summer studies program director. She added that this is the first time Kenya has been on PSU's study abroad agenda.

Wakhunga said there is a lot to be gained from studying abroad, and she feels that "churches and community organizations have a responsibility to help needy students."

The 12-credit program is offered through PSU's Summer Session Department and the fee includes travel, lodging and meals, with a one-day stop-over in Copenhagen, Denmark, and admission to the United Nation's World Conference of Women, which will be held in Kenya this July.
