Tennis open

Tennis players across the nation are readying for the First Annual Drum Major for Justice Open Tennis Tournament to be held in Atlanta June 8 through June 12.

Sanctioned by the United States Tennis Association, the contest is sponsored by sclc/Women as part of the sclc's annual Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Observance. The founding president of the sclc, King won the 1964 Nobel Peace Prize for his non-violent civil rights crusade and was assassinated April 4, 1968. The tennis tournament takes its name from King's description of himself in a speech shortly before his death.

Arthur Ashe, the first major Black tennis player, will be honorary co-chairman of the tournament at the South Fulton Tennis Center at 5645 Mason Road in College Park. Serving with him will be Atlanta Mayor Andrew Young, an sclc board member and an accomplished tennis player.

Junior players, aged 12 to 18, will play in their own Drum Major for Justice tournament June 2 through 8 at Washington Park Tennis Center at 1125 Lena Street NW, in Atlanta.
