The Polk County Housing Authority will accept bids for the Childcare Facility Project until Thursday, August 8, 1985, at 2:00 p.m. at the Authority Office, 204 S.W. Walnut Avenue, Dallas, Oregon. Plans will be available at the Authority Office on or after July 16, 1985. Work consists of rehabilitation of an existing 6,000 square foot, two story wood structure building for use as a childcare facility. Building is located at 336 S.W. River Drive, Dallas, Oregon. Anticipated project cost between \$80,000 to \$110,000. Project is funded through Oregon Community Development Program. Contractors must be able to post bid, performance, and payment bonds, and must be ready to start construction immediately. Bid packets may be obtained at the Authority Office. The bid packet may also be reviewed at the Salem Contractors Exchange, Salem, Oregon; and at both Construction Data Plans and the Northwest Plans Center in Portland, Oregon.

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For the first time in almost 20 years, the NASTAD (National Association of State and Territorial Apprenticeship Directors) will come to Portland for their national convention at the Hilton Hotel. In coordination with this event, the Apprenticeship and Training Division of the Bureau of Labor and Industries, and the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Apprenticeship & Training will host "Apprenticeship '85," a focus on **your future**, at Clackamas Town Center, July 29-30-31. It will feature over 40 job-related exhibitors and non-profit organizations, with a special focus on women and minorities in the non-traditional workplace. Each team will build a small structure, given the same time frame, blueprint, tools, etc. The celebrities, all talented individuals, of course, lack the training and knowledge that carpenter apprentices possess. The end result, the completion of the structure, will demonstrate how that lack of knowledge could affect our environment.
