As musical director for Frankie Lee in the late seventies, Bobby made yearly tours of California and Texas. with stops in Kansas City, Las Vegas and Portland. Since settling in the Bay area in 1980, he has been house guitarist for the Marin County, Sonoma County, San Francisco and Sacramento Blues Festivals and for the "Blue Monday Party" live radio broadcast and has performed at every Monterey Jazz Festival since 1981. In 1984, he toured Japan with the San Francisco Blues Festival.


