INVITATION TO BID

Sealed bid proposals for construction of access road and site work improvements for a 200,000 gallon storage reservoir for the Mulino Water District will be received by the Clackamas County Community Development Division on September 10, 1985 at 2:00 p.m. at O'Hara Hall, Marylhurst College, Marylhurst, Oregon. Bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. No bids will be received or considered after that time.

Proposed work will consist of construction of approximately 400 lineal feet of access road and site work for a 200,000 gallon steel water storage reservoir.

All bids must be submitted on the forms furnished in the Contract Documents, and must be accompanied by a bid bond or certified check made payable to Clackamas County Community Development Division in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the total amount of the bid.
