

Lou Rawls plays Portland

In 1966, Lou's Love Is A Hurtin' Thing received Grammy nominations for best Rhythm and Blues recording solo vocal performance. Lou won his first Grammy in 1967 for best R & B vocal performance on Dead End Street. The song was also nominated for best R & B recording.

A Grammy nomination for Your Good Thing (Is About to End) followed in 1969, and in 1971, Lou won the Grammy for best R & B performance for Natural Man.

Moving on to 1976 when Lou signed with Philadelphia International Records, he began an association with two masters of record production, Kenny Gamble and Leon Huff. Lou then received two Grammy nominations for You'll Never Find (Another Love Like Mine) and Groovy people. You'll Never Find went on to become a Gold and Platinum selling

Lou came into the 80s releasing more hit songs such as When the Night Comes, Wind Beneath My Wings and others. Lou is also the force behind Lou Rawls' Parade of Stars telethon and an honorary chairman for U.NC.F. Lou will be appearing on Sept. 8th at the Civic Auditorium

Miles Davis live at Arlene Schnitzer concert hall

Miles Davis, internationally-known jazz musician, will perform live at the Arlene Schnitzer Concert Hall, Saturday, September 21. The concert is part of An Evening of American Music and Dance, sponsored by Fred Meyer, Inc., Pepsi Cola Bottling Company, KKSN Classic Radio, Collins Foundation, Rose Tucker Charitable Trust and Frederick & Nelson, and presented by Artquake '85.

Also performing Saturday evening in order of appearance is Keith Martin Ballet Oregon presenting world premier of western style ballet choreographed by Keith Martin and award-winning Dennis Spaight with musical settings by local jazz artist, Cam Newton. Following a brief intermission, an orchestral segment by selected members of the Oregon Symphony, Portland Opera Orchestra and the Imperial Brass Ensemble, conducted by Neal Gittleman, will perform New England Tryptich by William Schuman. The Artquake Festival Orchestra will also perform Lincoln Portrait by Copland, with special guest, James DePreist narrating the Carl Sandburg text. Other musical presentations include Overture for the Seasons by Thomas Svoboda, and a Gershwin medley. Concluding An Evening of Music and Dance will be an exciting 75-minute performance by world-famous trumpeter Miles Davis and his seven-member band, playing America's own original art form - jazz - as only he can.


