## "Africa After the Famine"

The World Affairs Council of Oregon is sponsoring a lecture, "Africa After the Famine," with speaker Richard Derham of the Agency for International Development (AID), Thursday, September 12, 5:30 p.m. at Bank of California, 4th Floor, 707 S.W. Washington, Portland.

The Agency for International Development is an agency of the federal government that provides economic and technical assistance to some 70 developing countries throughout the world. As such, AID can find itself embroiled in political battle over its programs for people.

While AID does not establish foreign policy, it must nonetheless deal with diverse political views towards governments in developing and Third World countries. How does it resolve political squabbles while providing farmers with seeds and tools? Once the crisis is past, how does AID implement

its long-term plans that often include building free markets and an indigenous private sector in a developing country?

Richard Derham, head of AID's Bureau for Program and Policy Coordination, is responsible for developing policies that will assist countries in achieving self-sustaining economic development. He is currently monitoring the President's "Africa Hunger Initiative" and the steps taken to prevent future famines. Derham recently returned from a three-week tour of Africa to examine firsthand the devastation wrought by famine, and the assistance given by AID programs. Derham is an attorney and native of Seattle.

## Mission Herald disputes South African myths

Writing in July-August edition of the *Mission Herald*, official organ of the National Baptist Foreign Mission Board, Executive Secretary Reverend William Harvey took to task some of the accepted myths of the problems in South Africa.

"Those who place emphasis on the number of Blacks working for American Corporations in South Africa are being misled," he said. Reverend Harvey pointed to the 350 American firms doing business in South Africa. Only 135 have adopted the Sullivan Principles. Even these corporations cannot announce any hiring figures without government censorship. "Many who signed the Sullivan Principle Plan are getting failing grades," Harvey added.

Referring to the general statements that American business withdrawal would throw hundreds of thousands of Blacks into unemployment. Harvey said, "That is far from the truth. United States firms employ 70,000 Blacks and colored which put Blacks at less than one percent of those employed."

Harvey quoted the largest United States investor in South Africa, Mobil Oil. They have less than one-third African employees. He referred to a statement from the Washington Office on Africa as saying, "Even if the United States corporations wanted to be a good influence, the impact of their presence on Black workers would be negligible."

The other myth criticized by Rev. Harvey is the 1977 proposal of the Sullivan Principles by Reverend Leon Sullivan of Philadelphia. He is a member of the Board of General Motors. The proposal suggested fair employment practices, desegregated lockers, dining rooms and increased Blacks in management and supervision. Harvey feels that if all these conditions were met, "they would do nothing to the general apartheid in the country."

Blacks still would not be able to vote, they would not be able to buy land, would not be able to choose where they work, or live. Not even whom they marry. Even the legal requirement to carry a pass would remain.
