Cloud Nine opens at Storefront

Storefront Theatre is opening Cloud Nine, by British playwright Caryl Churchill on September 20th.

This innovative comedy about sexual identities features some of Portland's best actors in multiple roles. Starring are Gaynor Sterchi, Peter Fornara, Jan Powell, R. Dee Hafflich, Gary Powell, Joanna Malandruccolo and Bob McGranahan. Act I takes place one hundred years ago in Africa, while Act II takes place in present-day London. But the family from Act I has aged only 25 years. Cloud Nine has had a very successful production history, and has been well-received by both audiences and reviewers.

Storefront's production is directed by Susan Sweeney. Costumes are by Shaune Wunder, set design by Jeff Seats and lights by Jeff Forbes. the show opens on Friday, September 20th and plays Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights at 8 p.m. until November 16. Sizzling Portland visitors

Continuing innovation, tradition, and levish theatrical presentation of vocal jazz, the unique and popular Manhattan Transfer will perform in Portland, Thursday, October 3, at 8 p.m. in the Civic Auditorium.

The Transfer's new album release, Vocalese, is a stunning addition to their other chart-busting recording efforts, and is sure to be featured material in upcoming live performances. According to group member/producer Tim Hauser, "Vocalese... is the state of the art for jazz vocal singing." Hit songs by the group include "Java Jive," "Operator," "Birdland," "Four Brothers," and "The Boy From New York City." Vocalese contains 11 performances of classic jazz works, plus scintillating vocalese solos.

As always, the Transfer's new show will be a crowd pleaser, resplendent with original sets and costumes.
