

### Bears remain undefeated

The Chicago Bears are the only undefeated team in the NFL after eight weeks of play. The Bears beat Minnesota last Sunday 27-9, improving the record to 8-0 the best start in 43 years. Walton Payton gained 118 yards, the 67th 100-yard game of his career.

### St. Louis, Seattle Continue Slump

The St. Louis Cardinals and Neil Lomax continue their slump by losing 20-10 to the Houston Oilers. Lomax and the Cards have lost five of their last six games. The Cards' once high-scoring offense has been absent during this period.

The New York Jets defeated the Seattle Seahawks for the first time ever last Sunday 17-14. Before the start of the season, many were saying the Seahawks would be in the Super Bowl.

The loss to the Jets brought their record to 4-4. During the contest, Seahawks' running back Curt Warner was injured.

### Kansas City wins Series

The Kansas City Royals became the first team in the World Series' history to lose their first two games at home and win the World Series. The Royals defeated the St. Louis Cardinals 11-0 behind the pitching of Bret Saberhagen. Saberhagen pitched a 5-hit shutout, his second victory in the series.

Portland Darryl Motley hit a towering two-run home run off John Tudor in the second inning. The Cardinals set a series record by batting only .185 as a team.

In other baseball news, Billy Martin was fired as Manager of the New York Yankees for the fourth time. Lou Piniella was named the new manager.

### Ewing

Patrick Ewing made his N.B.A. Saturday against the Philadelphia 76ers. Although the Knicks lost 99-89, Ewing scored 18 points, had six rebounds, three blocked shots and two steals.

Ewing's efforts, although good, weren't better than all-pro Sixers' center Moses Malone. Malone had 35 points, 13 rebounds and three blocked shots.

State Warriors last Sunday in the Memorial Coliseum 116-99. Portland was paced by Kiki Vandeweghe and Clyde Drexler. Vandeweghe scored 25 points and Drexler added 19. Kenny Carr had a game high 13 rebounds, four on the offense end.

### P.I.L. update

#### Madison/Benson showdown

Friday night Madison will meet Benson for first place in the P.I.L. Both teams will enter the game with 8-0 records. Madison beat Jefferson last Friday 29-6 to remain undefeated. In that game, Madison Charles Harris returned a punt 64 yards for a touchdown.

Benson demolished Lincoln 54-7. Techman Terrance Taylor returned a block kick 69 yards for a touchdown, and Paul Jackson scored two touchdowns which brought his total to 19 for the season.

In other N.B.A. news, the San Antonio Spurs traded allstar guard George Gervin to the Chicago Bulls for David Greenwood. Gervin will now team in the back court with Michael Jordan to give the Bulls a strong scoring punch.

### Ducks win

The Oregon Ducks defeated San Diego State 49-37 last Saturday. The Ducks are 3-4 overall and 2-2 in Pac-10. Lew Barnes caught 9 passes during the game and became the Ducks' number 4 all-time career receiver. Aztec receiver Webster Slaughter had 15 receptions.

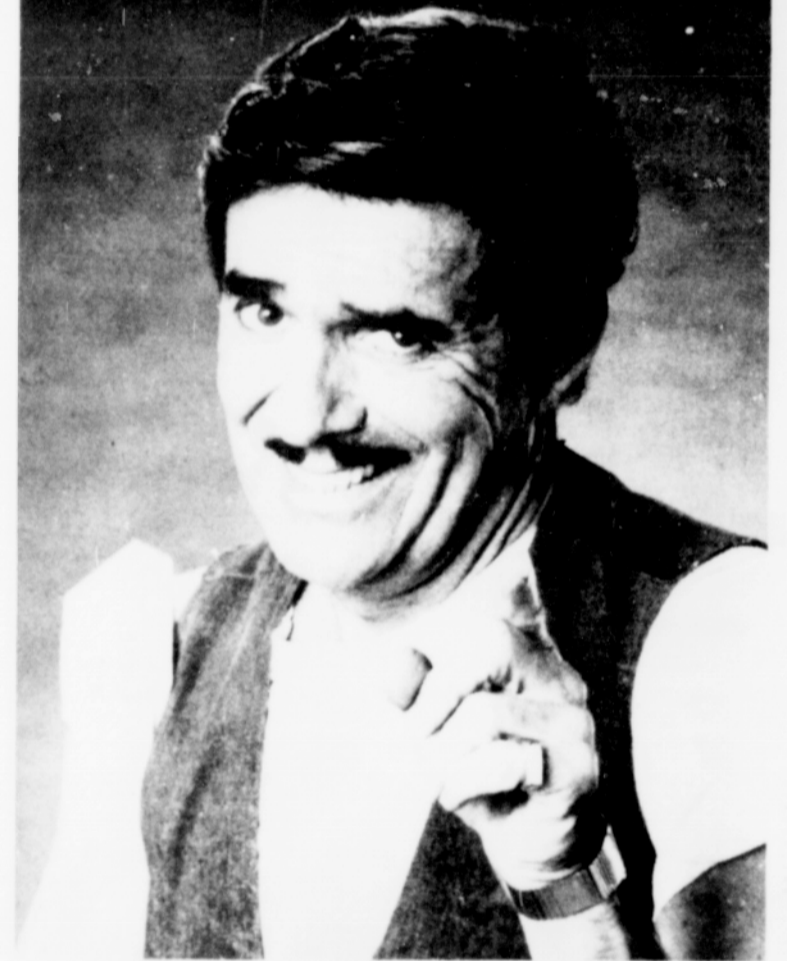

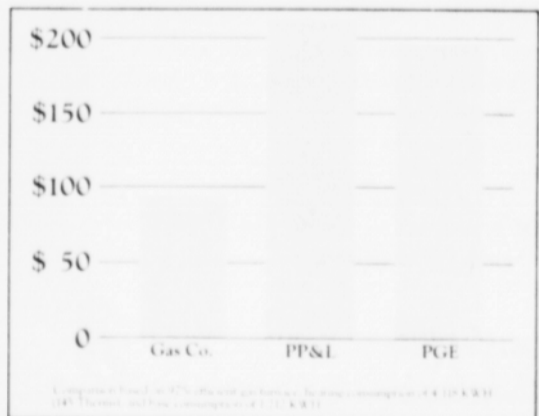
