Rocky IV

Rocky's story is a legend born on the decaying south side of Philadelphia where, as an unknown and unambitious club fighter, he received the chance of a lifetime from the publicity-hungry heavyweight champion of the world.

In *Rocky I* his whole life boiled down to a million-to-one shot at the title. By fighting Apollo Creed to a draw in fifteen brutal rounds on that hot summer night, Rocky Balboa earned much more. He won the love, respect and admiration of an entire nation.

Eight years have passed since then, five since Rocky finally captured the world heavyweight title from Creed in an uncontested victory at the Philadelphia Spectrum. For three years he successfully defended his crown against challengers from around the world, until the sudden death of his long-time manager and trainer, Mickey Goldmill, led to his humiliating defeat under the fists of the streetwise and ambitious Clubber Lang.

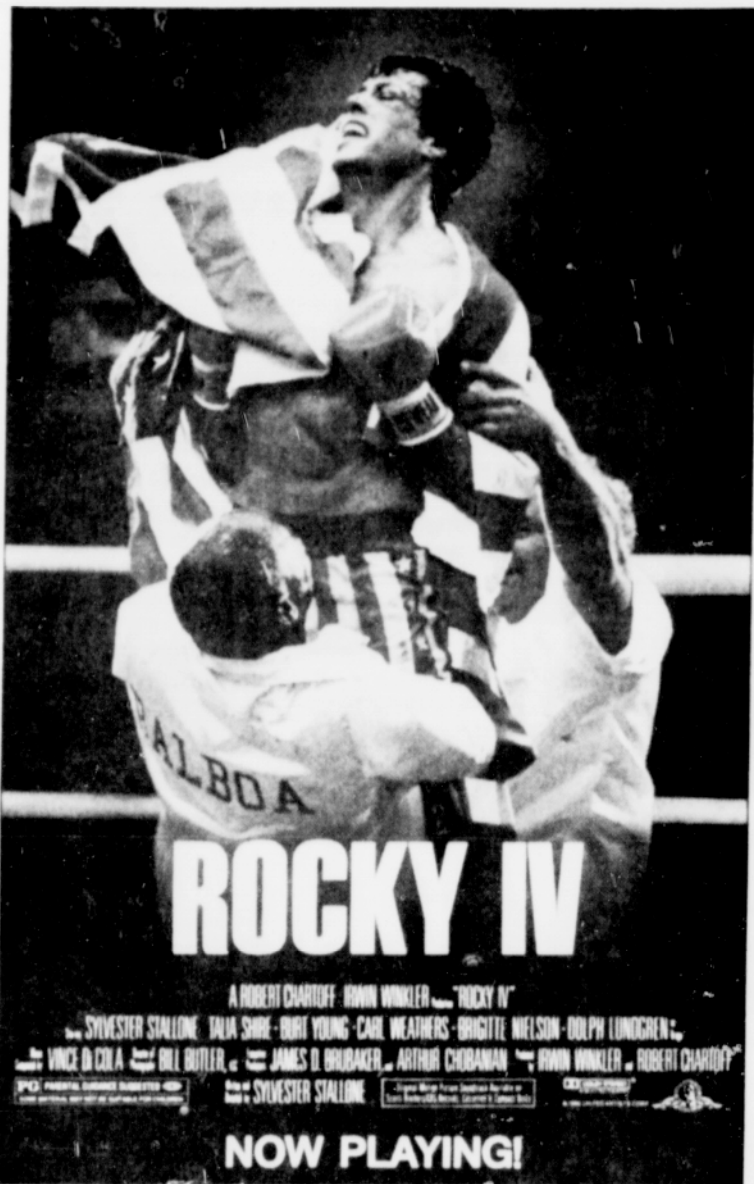
Through the love of his wife, Adrian, the companionship of his old friend, Paulie, as well as the experience and wisdom of his former adversary, Apollo Creed, the famous southpaw came back with a vengeance to regain his title—knocking out Lang in the third round of their vicious rematch with a murderous and unexpected right hook.

Today, with more than 75 hard professional fights behind him and a lifetime of affluence ahead, some say that Rocky Balboa has nothing left to prove. He and Adrian are growing closer with each passing day, and the champion has found a new challenge equally rewarding, that of sharing the ideas and ideals he cherishes with their only son, Rocky Jr.

Half a world away, however, a new adversary is being prepared to battle the American. He is a man who represents the athlete of the future, trained by the most advanced methods of science and technology. He is a fighting machine of unequalled size and power. He is Comrade Ivan Drago, world heavyweight amateur champion and citizen of the Soviet Union.

On the surface, the confrontation between Rocky Balboa and Ivan Drago seems to be an extension of the Cold War between the United States and the Soviet Union.

Yet, *Rocky IV* is really the story of a battle between the best of two different generations, one who draws his strength and power from within, and another who relies upon the miraculous "technology of human performance" for his power. Both men will enter the ring as champions, but only one will leave it as the victor.

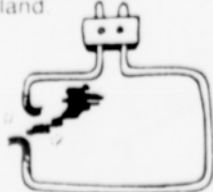
