Future Global Order symposium

A group of prominent Oregon educators and scientists will explore "The Possibilities for Future Global Order" in a nine-week symposium at Westminster Presbyterian Church, N.E. 16th & Hancock in Portland.

Sponsored by the Westminster Adult Education Committee, the symposium, which runs Sundays 11:30 a.m.-12:15 p.m. Jan. 5-March 9, will look at a wide range of topics dealing with the ingredients of bringing about a preferred global society.

"In this time of world tensions, we wanted to look at whether or not different peoples living together peacefully is even possible," says Wayne Potter, symposium subcommittee chairman.

Topics being covered include the role of law in preventing nuclear war and supporting human rights, the practicality of world peace, the role of a stable world economy, implications of changing from an industrial to an information society, the role of biotechnical advances, re-emergence

of religious fundamentalism, the family and natural resources.

"We've tried to look at those traditional issues which affect war and peace and are asking our speakers to examine them in relation to their likely future effect on our ability to live together," Potter said.

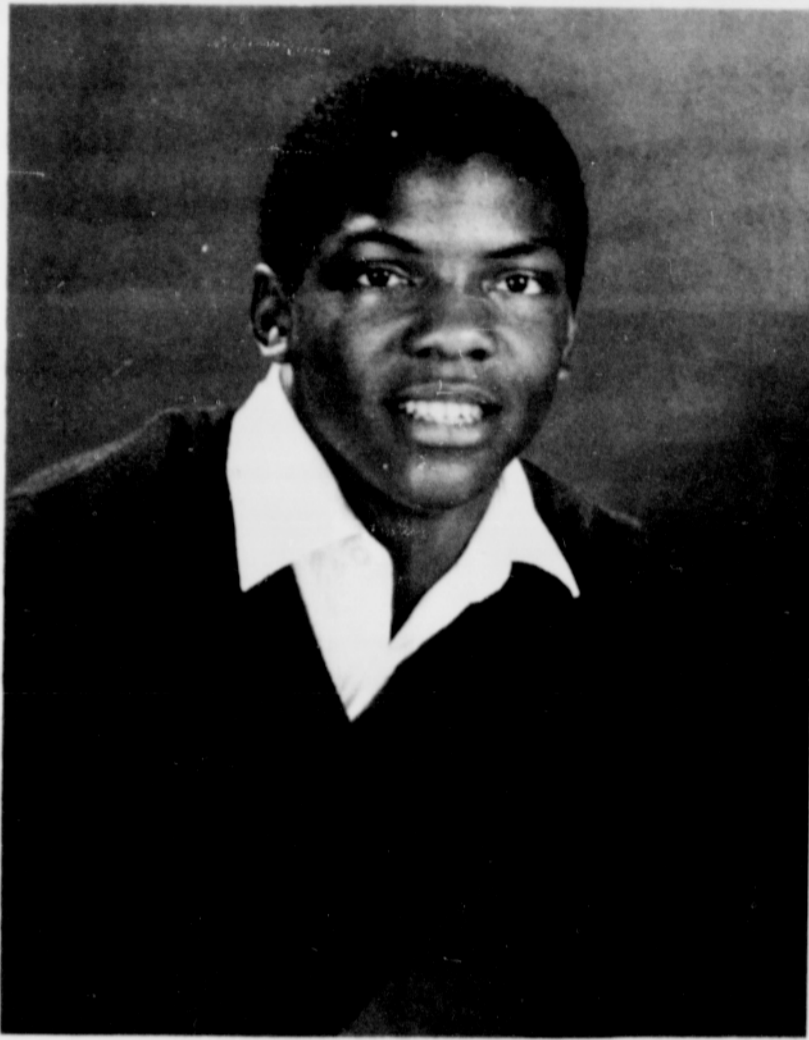
The topic may sound a bit utopian, he admits, but insists that considerations will be based on as much practicality as possible.

He likened Westminster's symposium to a "Great Decisions" series in that "one of the most critical issues of our time has got to be whether or not we can keep from blowing ourselves into oblivion."

Anyone interested in exploring the prospects for a peaceful future should find the symposium interesting, he said.

Westminster spokespersons are hoping the free sessions will draw interest from a wide variety of people.
