"Man of Conscience-A Conversation with Bishop Desmond Tutu" will be taped before a live audience in Detroit on the birthday of another Nobel Peace Prize winner, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

The studio audience of all political

persuasions and viewers calling in from around the country will discuss with Bishop Tutu topics such as the Bishop's method of fighting separation of races in South Africa, divestiture of U.S. financial interests in South Africa, and schisms within the American Black population on

"Man of Conscience" will air the day before the first celebration of Dr. King's birthday as a national holiday. The program will note the similarities between Bishop Tutu and Dr. King in the non-violent struggle for racial
