

Fast against apartheid

Members of the Lewis and Clark College community will fast for five days against race discrimination starting Monday, Jan. 20.

The fast, sponsored by the college's South Africa Action Group (SAAG), is in support of American Blacks continuing the 120-year civil rights struggle, and in solidarity with South African Blacks. Objectives include raising awareness of racism in all its forms, and urging stronger action regarding divestment from South Africa by the Board of Trustees of Lewis and Clark College. The group also asks that the board initiate a policy of social responsibility regarding investments.

At a recent board meeting the trustees voted to limit South African investments to companies adhering to the Sullivan Principles despite a four-hour-long silent vigil urging total divestment. More than 50 students stood outside the board room.

The Sullivan Principles are mild workplace reforms affecting less than 1 percent of the Black South African population.

In addition to the fast, half-hour silent vigils will be held during the entire week of the 20th in front of the administration building. The fasters will sleep on campus in the chapel basement.

SAAG scheduled the fast for the week of Jan. 20 in honor of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday.
