Vanessa Bell Armstrong has been nominated for the Best Soul Gospel Female Grammy award along with Tremaine Hawkins, Shirley Caesar and Albertina Walker — all well established singers of Gospel music. The modest mother of five can't understand why.

Although she has been singing since she was four, she did not record an album until 1981 when her husband Samuel persuaded her to make a demo tape. The resulting album, "Peace Be Still", is doing well in sales, but the Detroit-born Vanessa still has difficulty believing she is a star. Armstrong says her goal is to "just be real and win souls for Christ. Like one of my songs says, I don't want all my labor to be in vain." She plans to record new material in April.

Obo Addy to Perform

Noted African musician Obo Addy and his group KuKrudu will give a free concert in honor of Black Awareness Week at Mt. Hood Community College Monday, Feb. 10 from noon to 1:30 p.m. in the Vista Dining Center.

Born the son of a Wonche priest in Ghana, West Africa, Addy grew up playing traditional Ghanaian music and later incorporated American Jazz and pop into his personal compositions. The resulting sound is created with African drums as well as a trumpet, trombone, saxophone and flute and has become Addy's signature.

Since an appearance at the 1972 Olympic Games in Munich, Germany, Addy has toured throughout the world, playing in Australia, the Mid East and Europe. He has now settled in Portland and has recorded two albums with Avcoet Records.

Black Awareness Week is scheduled for Feb. 10-14 at MHCC and, in addition to Addy's performance, will feature an art exhibit entitled Black History in America.
