OMSI II Opens at Lloyd Center

A ribbon cutting ceremony opening an exciting new concept in Portland will take place Saturday, March 15 at Lloyd Center. At noon the doors to OMSI II will open to the public. This fun and exciting OMSI II will be housed in the former Woolworth facility and will remain there through Labor Day.

Herb Cawthorne, Chief Executive Officer of The Urban League and City Commissioner Margaret Strachan will be presiding over the opening ceremonies which begin at noon. Kenny Carr of the Portland Trailblazers will be making a special appearance later in the afternoon. Max the robot, specially dressed in a new black tuxedo, will also make a special appearance.

OMSI II will herald a fresh new OMSI look — light, bright, exciting and fun! In addition to new exhibits, many of the most popular OMSI exhibits have been redesigned to encourage participation and fun for each visitor.

As part of an ongoing commitment to benefit youth and expose new audiences to science, 14 of the OMSI II explainer/guides will be teenagers in

training from the Portland Public Schools, The Business Youth Exchange and The Portland Private Industry Council. Spanish, French, Chinese and Laotian are just a few of the nationalities and languages which will be spoken at OMSI II by some of these explainers.

Care Ambulance Helps Launch Donor Campaign

Care Ambulance is joining with over 650 member companies of the American Ambulance Association in launching its "Gift of Life" Organ Donor campaign, geared to meet the nation's critical need for donor organs.

Care Ambulance is distributing "Gift of Life" Organ Donor flyers that include answers to commonly asked questions about organ donation along with an organ donor wallet card. By signing and carrying the card, a person authorizes the use of their organs after their death by others in medical need.

"The gift of life is the most precious thing a person can give," said Sharon Henry, spokesperson of Care. "Just by carrying an organ donor card, you can save someone's life — even after your own life has ended."

Today over 25 different organs and tissues, including the heart, lungs, liver and pancreas can be transplanted successfully. "Without an available supply of donor organs, these success stories are impossible," Henry explained.

"As pre-hospital care and transportation providers," said Henry, "our only interest is in saving lives and providing fast, professional response. It's up to the hospital personnel and the transplant team to make the actual transplant decisions.

"We're launching this 'Gift of Life' campaign to make our own lives more meaningful and to improve the length and quality of life for others," Henry said.
