Brie Cheese Recalled

The federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has recalled Primrose brand brie cheese because it may be contaminated with *Listeria monocytogenes*, a potentially deadly bacteria, according to Leonard Kunzman, Director of the Oregon Department of Agriculture.

All retail outlets for this cheese have been notified by FDA of the recall, and Oregon Department of Agriculture and FDA field personnel will make contact follow-ups at all listed retail outlets in Oregon to insure the cheese has been removed from sale.

"Under no circumstances should individuals consume any Primrose brand brie cheese. They should instead either discard it or return it to place of purchase for a refund," advised Director Kunzman.

In a related event yesterday, all Rodeo brand Mexican-style cheese was recalled from Oregon retail stores following reports of illness in Arizona, linked to *Listeria* contamination.

The *Listeria* bacteria can be dangerous to pregnant women and their fetuses, sometimes causing stillbirths. It may also be dangerous to small children, frail elderly persons, or persons with weakened immune systems. In healthy adults it may cause short-lived flu-like illness. The bacteria is killed by proper pasteurization.

The Problem of "Love" in Spring

"Now is the time to ward it off humanely," said Friends of Animals President, Alice Herrington. Warding off the signs of love in the dog and cat involves spaying the female pets and altering the males. Friends of Animals, in cooperation with veterinarians in this county and 800 others throughout the

nation, offers low-cost spaying and altering services.

"If you breed and give away puppies and kittens, you consign to death the young dogs and cats awaiting adoption in the shelters," warns Herrington.

In counties where Friends of Animals Spay Program has been met with cooperation from pet-owners, the killing of animals at local animal shelters has been cut in half in just five years.

Alumni Phonathon

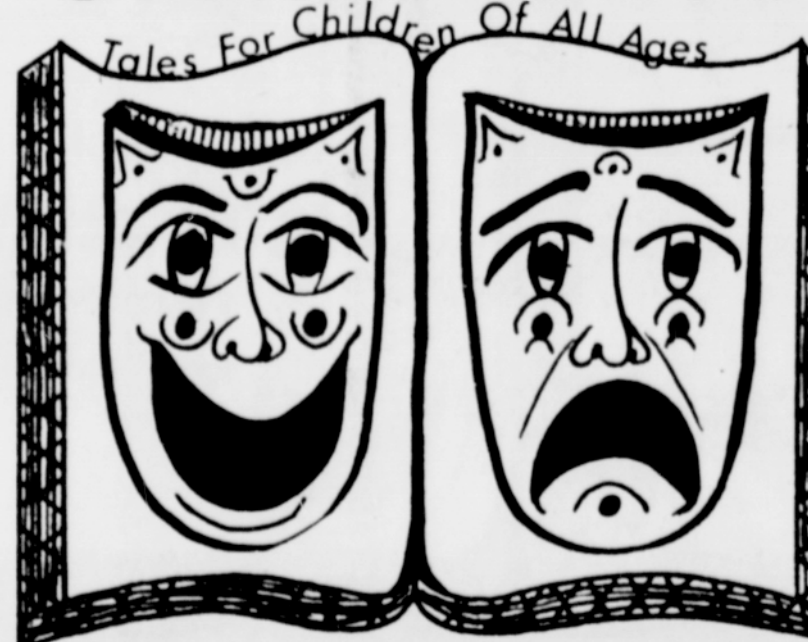
Set at Western
