'The Frog Prince' Leaps to Center Stage For One Performance at CAC

The Frog Prince, a touring production of the Interstate Firehouse Cultural Center in Portland, will land on the Columbia Arts Center stage after making the hop across the river on May 3 for one performance. Curtain time is 2:30, Saturday afternoon.

This version of the childhood classic was written by Pulitzer Prize winner David Mamet. It is based upon the Brothers Grimm story of a dashing young prince — princes are always dashing — who is turned into a frog for his arrogant treatment of a peasant woman. His only hope at regaining his former physique is to find a pure and honest woman willing to give him a kiss.

Finding such a woman proves to be tougher than the young frog prince imagines, and on the way back to prince-dom he learns the virtue of patience, kindness, humility and friendship. Playwright Mamet's contemporary point of view of this traditional story will make the production appealing to adults as well as children.

Tickets for the Saturday afternoon performance are \$2.50 for kids under 12 and \$3.50 for anyone over 12. Tickets may be purchased at the Columbia Arts Center during business hours or on Saturdays between noon and 5 p.m. The Arts Center is located at 400 West Evergreen Blvd. in Vancouver.

It's a Mark Twain Fantasy Come True!

Beginning in mid-April, thousands of school-aged youngsters will be able to experience life above the water, learn about life beneath the water, and view Portland from the water.

It's all part of the Sternwheeler Columbia Gorge's program of field trips for kids. For an hour and a half, the children can travel aboard the sternwheeler from S.W. Front Avenue and Salmon, under bridges and past Portland's skyline to industrial Swan Island, and then return.

While on the boat, there will be plenty for them to do. The Sternwheeler Columbia Gorge has prepared educational materials for the kids and instructors' manuals for teachers or chaperones. Information will be available about the history of the Willamette River and its impact on the community, and there will be some surprises for the youngsters as well. A special surprise will be the appearance of a "riverboat captain" to spin yarns about river life.

Shadburne Sets Up Fund for Development of Blue Lake Park

This week the Board of County Commissioners will look at an ordinance to establish an interest-bearing account for the purpose of receiving donations for planning, development, acquisition and marketing for the parks system.

This will permit revenue generated by the parks division to directly benefit the parks system thereby stabilizing funding by reducing dependency on the general fund.

Shadburne, a long time supporter of parks and increased recreational facilities, feels that this recommendation from the Blue Lake Taskforce "is imperative, if we ever want to see the parks in Multnomah County developed to their full potential."
