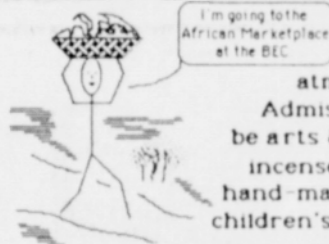

Portland, OR — The annual spring 1986 Ebony Fashion Fair will be on tour here Friday, April 25. The show, sponsored by Ebony Magazine in conjunction with The Links, will begin at 8 p.m. at the Red Lion Motor Inn.
