

D.W.I. — The Deadliest Weapon in America!

Portland, Oregon — Drunk drivers are the single greatest cause of violence in America. They have claimed more than one million lives on our highways over the past four decades. An accident occurs every 21 minutes as the result of a drunk driver. And, despite increased public awareness and harsher drinking and driving laws, the statistics continue to escalate.

KOIN-TV examines this perplexing issue in a poignant 2-hour special, "DWI — The Deadliest Weapon in America," scheduled to air Monday, April 21 from 8-10 p.m.

"We've all seen the statistics — they're startling and they're painful," says KOIN-TV General Manager and Vice President R.M. "Mick" Schafbuch. "KOIN-TV airs this special as part of an on-going commitment to the community, in hopes of curbing this killer and preventing the needless loss of lives!"

The first hour of this special will be hard-hitting documentary on drunk driving that takes a serious and often painful look at this national dilemma. This documentary features interviews with individuals who have lost loved ones at the hands of a drunk driver, as well as discussions with Bob Anastas, founder of S.A.D.D. — Students Against Driving Drunk, and the founder of M.A.D.D. — Mothers Against Drunk Driving — Candy Lightner. "DWI" also examines the problems in detecting and prosecuting the drunk driver within our judicial system. The National Traffic Safety Board says only one of every two thousand drunk drivers on any given night is pulled over!

"KOIN-TV will follow-up with a live studio discussion from 9-10 p.m. focusing on teen-age drinking and driving.

Hosted by "Newsroom Six at Noon" Anchor Eric Schmidt and Reporter David Gillin, this discussion will allow input from an audience consisting of high-school and college students, representatives from SADD, MADD and SAFE RIDE, as well as local law enforcement authorities and an Assistant D.A. Viewer call-ins will be encouraged throughout the discussion.

This is a particularly volatile time for young adults as plans for prom night and graduation often include parties where alcoholic beverages are consumed. It is a time of celebration; of breaking free from the restraints of home. It is also a time of serious danger.

Eight thousand young Americans are killed each year in an alcohol-related accident. Teenagers are killing themselves, and others, at a rate more than double the death rate for any other age group. Drunk driving is the number one killer of young-adults in the United States!

Find out why the tragedy continues and what you can do to stop it. Watch "DWI, The Deadliest Weapon in America" Monday, April 21 from 8-10 p.m.

Shriners Come Together, A Historical Event

The Northeast Shrine Club invited the Prince Hall Shriners of Mina Temple #68, (A.E.A.O.N.M.) to participate with them in sponsoring a free screening clinic, last Saturday at the Lloyd Center office of Dr. Douglass Day.

This was a historical event, for it marked the first time in the history of Oregon that White and Black Shriners have worked together.

"This may be the first time on the west coast that Black and White Shriners have participated in a project," said William H. Haygood.

Haygood is Ill. Potentate, Mina Temple #68. He said his temple is planning future projects with the Northeast Shriners. "We may have differences, but our goal is to help children," said Haygood.

The object of last Saturday's health

project was to encourage members of the "minority cultures to take advantage of the free expert services at the Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children and Out-Patient Clinics.

The Shrine Hospital for Crippled Children was established in 1922. Both inpatient and out-patient care are given to children from infancy to the 18th birthday regardless of race, religion, or relationship to a Shriner.

There is no charge for any of the care or services provided by a Shrine Hospital. Admission is based on medical and financial need. The Burns Institutes accept children who have been burned and need immediate care, and children needing plastic reconstructive or restorative surgery and rehabilitation, as a result of burn injuries.

All services are paid for by the Shriners.

G.E.D. Testing Now Available at PCC Southeast Center

General Education Development tests will be given on a part-time basis at the Portland Community College Southeast Center, 2850 S.E. 82nd Ave., starting April 10.

Sherry A. Robinson, PCC's director of Central Student Services, said the testing service will be available from 1 to 4 p.m. on Thursdays, under the direction of Clerk Jennifer Jose. The program will accommodate 15 students per week.

Robinson said students must make

appointments in advance and will be required to pay \$15 if they are taking all five parts of the test battery for the first time. Those who are repeating tests will be charged \$3 if they are PCC students, or \$5 if they come to the center from an outside agency.

Southeast Center will be the third PCC location offering the GED tests. Other testing sites are at Sylvania and Cascade campuses.
