This is an opportunity to work in a variety of assessment and evaluation activities. Professionals and students have found these positions to be personally and professionally rewarding. NWREL's Evaluation and Assessment work includes providing information on tests, assisting classroom teachers to use tests, assisting districts to evaluate programs, and improving staff evaluations for staff development. We also provide Chapter 1 evaluation and effective program consultations and workshops for state and local staff in the 13 western states. We annually provide a wide variety of services on a contract basis. Examples include developing tests and conducting state migrant program evaluations.

One purpose of an internship is to increase the participation of minorities and women in educational research and development. Person(s) selected for internships must be enrolled in a degree program and work less than full-time.

QUALIFICATIONS: We expect that an individual applicant may not have experience in all areas as listed below. We will select the candidate(s) having the best combination of skills and experience. General qualifications are indicated below.

- Enrolled in a doctorate or masters degree program in Educational Evaluation, Statistics, Measurement or related area.

- Knowledge and interest in the testing and evaluation of students and staff.
- Familiarity with tests and evaluation terminology concepts and tools.
- Familiarity with research on effective education.
- Ability to assist with evaluating Chapter 1, special education, bilingual, or other school programs.
- Good writing skills, particularly experience with technical writing. Ability to conduct literature reviews and synthesize information.
- Experience with computerized data bases, programs on large mainframe computers, e.g., SPSS or microcomputers.
