Sealed bids will be received by the Director of Purchasing, Multnomah County Purchasing Division, 2505 S.E. 11th Ave., Portland, OR 97202 for:

A) Install approximately 2200' of 8" line and 4 hydrants on S.E. 72nd from Ogden to Crystal Springs; B) Install approximately 650' of 6" line on S.E. Crystal Springs from 72nd to 75th; and C) Install about 500' of 8" line and 2 hydrants on 52nd from Knapp to Flavel.

PREQUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS

MINORITY AND FEMALE BUSINESS UTILIZATION

All bidders are hereby specifically advised that these conditions require a minimum of 10% of the total bid amount for Minority Business Enterprise participation in one or more of the following subcontract areas: bidders option and 2% of the total bid amount for Female Business Enterprise participation in one or more of the following subcontract areas: bidders option.

NONDISCRIMINATION

Bidders on this work will be required to comply with the provisions of Federal Executive Order 11246. The requirements for Bidders and Contractors are explained in the Specifications.

No bid will be received or considered unless the bid contains a statement by the bidder as part of his bid that the requirements of 279.350, 279.352, 279.355 and 279.356 shall be met.

No proposal will be considered unless accompanied by a check payable to Multnomah County, certified by a responsible bank, or in lieu thereof, a surety bond for an amount equal to ten percent (10%) of the aggregate proposal. The successful bidder shall furnish a bond satisfactory to the Board in the full amount of the contract. Multnomah County reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

DRIVERS

Elderly and handicapped people are driven to and from various destinations according to the schedule provided by the dispatcher at Special Mobility Services. Hot meals are delivered to the home bound by drivers for Loaves and Fishes. Visually impaired clients of Vision Northwest need to be driven to support group meetings throughout the tri-county area. The American Cancer Society needs volunteers to drive cancer patients to and from treatment centers.

VARIETY

The Salvation Army uses volunteers to help the agency provide a variety of services to its clients. Receptionists answer phones and provide information to visitors, instructors teach calligraphy, bridge and a variety of arts and crafts to senior citizens or young people, infant and toddler care is provided for teenage mothers at a residential facility.

BIKE TRIPS

Eight different week-long bike trips for teenagers are being offered this summer by the Washington County Branch of the YMCA. Trip leaders help plan, recruit counselors, maintain trip records and have the responsibility to ensure that the trip is a safe and enjoyable experience. Four counselors accompany each group and assist the leader with supervision. Orientation, training and check-out rides are required of leaders and counselors before the trips.
