

**NOTICE OF INTENT
TO REQUEST PROPOSALS FOR
CONSULTING ENGINEERING SERVICES**

Proposals Due July 21, 1986

The Oregon Department of Transportation, Highway Division is seeking a Consulting Engineering firm to assist the Division in the rehabilitation of the lift span mechanism of the northbound Columbia River (Interstate) Bridge on the Pacific Highway (I-5) in Multnomah County, Oregon and Clark County, Washington. The work to be done will consist of two phases.

The first phase will be an inspection and review of the existing machinery culminating in a report of condition and necessary rehabilitation work to put the equipment into the best possible condition. The second phase will consist of preparation of contract plans, specification, and cost estimates to contract the rehabilitation work.

This work will be financed in part by utilization of Federal Highway Administration funds. All applicable Minority Business Enterprise, Affirmative Action, Equal Employment Opportunity, and non-discrimination programs will pertain to the project.
