

PUBLIC NOTICE DBE/WBE GOALS

It is the policy of the Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District of Oregon (Tri-Met) that Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) and Women Business Enterprises (WBE'), as defined in 49 CFR 23.62 and 23.5, respectively, shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts and subcontracts financed in whole or in part with federal funds from the U.S. Department of Transportation.

In this regard, Tri-Met has established overall goals for Federal Fiscal Year 1986-87 of 10% DBE and 4% WBE participation in federally-assisted contracts.

REPLACEMENT OF A 12-INCH WATER MAIN IN COMMERCIAL STREET S.E. FROM MADRONA AVENUE TO BROWNING AVENUE

Sealed bids will be received at the office of the City Recorder, City Hall, Room 205, Salem, Oregon, until but not after 11:00 a.m., Local Time on September 3, 1986, at which time all bids will be publicly opened and read aloud at the Council Chambers, Civic Center, 555 Liberty Street S.E., Salem, Oregon for the "REPLACEMENT OF A 12-INCH WATER MAIN IN COMMERCIAL STREET S.E. FROM MADRONA AVENUE TO BROWNING AVENUE."

The proposed work consists of: installation of 2,318 lineal feet of 12-inch ductile iron pipe and appurtenant work.

Plans, specifications and other bid documents may be inspected and obtained at the office of the City of Salem, Department of Public Works, 555 Liberty Street S.E., Room 325, Salem, Oregon. The bidder shall not file the book of "Standard Construction Specifications" with his bid.

Bids shall be made on the forms furnished by the City, addressed, and mailed or delivered to the City Recorder, City Hall, Room 205, Salem, Oregon 97301, in a sealed envelope plainly marked "BID ON THE COMMERCIAL STREET WATER MAIN," and the name and address of the bidder.

A surety bond, cashier's check or certified check of the bidder made payable to the City of Salem, in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the bid must accompany each bid as security. Bid security of all save the three lowest bidders will be returned following the bid opening; all bid security will be refunded upon execution of the contract by the successful bidder.

No bid will be received or considered by the City of Salem unless the bid contains a statement by the bidder the provisions of ORS 279.350 shall be included in his contract.

The attention of bidders is directed to the provisions of Chapter 97, Salem Revised Code, concerning unlawful employment practices. Violation of such provisions shall be grounds for immediate termination of this contract without recourse by the contractor.
