How to make your seat belt lock.

If you've ever tugged on your seat belt to try to get it to lock, you might be interested to learn that today's belt systems are specially designed to lock only when your entire car comes to a sudden

The belt apparatus contains a tiny pendulum attached to a locking mechanism; when your car stops suddenly, the pendulum swings forward, activating the locking device that keeps you from slamming into the windshield (and fellow passengers).

A simple test will show you how well your car-sensitive belt works. On a dry day, find an empty, level parking lot, drive at a very slow speed (5 mph is sufficient), and hit the brakes hard. Your belt will lock
