

# Businessman Indicted For Drug Trafficking

Portland businessman, Bobby Lee, owner of Rickshaw Charlie's Restaurant, 331 NW Davis, was arrested last Thursday morning by agents of the Drug Enforcement Administration and detectives of the Portland Police Bureau. He was charged with conspiring to possess, with intent to distribute cocaine and marijuana.

According to a press statement released by the United States Attorney's Office, Lee's arrest was ordered by the U.S. Attorney's Office for Western District of Pennsylvania in Pittsburgh. Lee was one of 18 defendants named in the federal indictment and charged with violating Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841 (A) (1) and 846. If found guilty, Lee could be sentenced to 15 years in prison and fined \$250,000.

U.S. Magistrate William M. Dale released Lee without bail. Lee's alleged involvement in drug dealing first came to the public's attention back in May. That is when the Multnomah County District Attorney's Office and the U.S. Attorney's Office accused a Portland Police officer, Bruce Gary Harrington, of informing Lee that he was under investigation for drug trafficking. Harrington is the husband of former Portland Police Chief Penny E. Harrington.

Both U.S. Attorney Charles H. Turner and Multnomah County District Attorney Michael D. Schrank urged that Gary Harrington be investigated by an independent body to see whether he violated police rules. Their recommendation was one of the reasons the Lezak Commission was formed.

The Lezak Commission later recommended that Mayor Clark replace Chief Harrington and that Fary Harrington be given a 10-day suspension for associating with Lee. Since then, both the Harringtons have filed for stress-related disability. The Fire and Police Disability and Retirement Fund Board

has already denied Officer Harrington's disability claim. Harrington has challenged the Board's decision in court. So far, the Board hasn't ruled on the former Chief's stress

claim.

Lee's arrest is part of a continuing investigation and prosecution by federal authorities and the Portland Police Bureau.

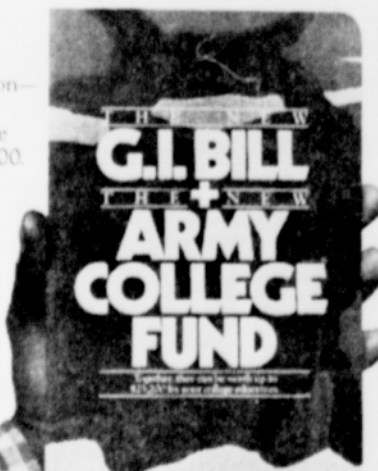
