Wilbur Grafton Hammond

Mr. Hammond passed quietly on Tuesday, October 21, 1986 in Oregon City, Oregon, after a long illness with Alzheimer's disease. He was born in Formosa, Arkansas to Keiffer and Daisy Hammond.

Wilbur Hammond, known as "Butch" to some and as "Graff" to others, served in the Army during WW II. Later he moved to Oregon where he worked at Ziedell Machinery & Supply Co.

He married Geraldine Elizabeth Callier and they had two sons, Dwayne and Leneld. He was a member of Vancouver Ave. First Baptist Church, a Trustee of the Executive Oregon Laborers Union, a Sunday School teacher, and coached Little League basketball and baseball.
