### Local Church Marches On to Expand Community Action Into a "New Dimension"

It started five years ago when Reverend Roy L. Tate set out to meet the spiritual needs of his church members, and to meet the practical needs of non-members in North Portland's Albina district. He started his church at 4237 N. Mississippi with just he, his wife Diane Tate and children Shurita and Troy. He was a youthful 31 years old. He now has over 100 members, many of whom were involved in a "negative" lifestyle, but have since turned their life around!

The success of his five years of achievements was earmarked by the recent purchase of a new church facility at 1552 N. Killingsworth. The significance of that purchase means Reverend Tate now has room to expand the following community action programs: drug and alcohol counseling, free food and clothes distribution, community information center, and other needed programs.

As a positive statement to the community, Reverend Tate wants to capsulize the new acquisition with a church dedication march and ceremony on November 23rd. However, the city's Special Events Committee denied his church the right to march in the streets with motorcycle police escorts. Later, however, Reverend Tate appealed that decision to the Portland City Council and was granted the permission to march. Interestingly enough, the march will not only include over 100 church members, out of state guests, but some city and county officials as well. The dedication services will begin November 19, 20, 21 at 7:30 p.m., and end with the march on November 23 at 2:30 p.m. It will conclude the week-long dedication





### **PCC** and Portland Chamber of Commerce Present Teleconference

'How to Be the Best Seller in Your Town, the Art and Science of Selling," will be presented as a live teleconference by Portland Community College and the Portland Chamber of Commerce on Monday, Nov. 24, at the PCC Sylvania Campus, 12000 S.W. 49th Ave.

The conference will show sales people how to keep prospects in an emotional buying state throughout the selling process, with the result of increasing the sales person's closing rate.

The nationally-televised portion of the conference will include as presenters Fred Davis, vice president for marketing of Jet America, a major airline; Tom McElligott, of McElligott Advertising, Minneapolis; and host D. Forbes Ley, president of Sales Success Institute, Inc., and author of "The Best Seller." Lev's book will be provided to each teleconference participant.

Portland panelist will be Bruce Maland, senior marketing representative for Honeywell Information Systems.

Program topics will include problems in selling, the selling process, attention getters, handling objections and closing, prospecting, understanding personalities, self image and live questions and answers.

Persons from small to mediumsized companies who sell products or services in excess of \$500 are target participants for the teleconference, especially if they depend upon commissions for income.

The program will be from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. in Room A1, Science Technology Building at Sylvania Campus. Advance registration is \$65, or \$75 if paid at the door, For two or more persons from the same company, the charge is \$55. Lunch is included.
