First Local Black-Owned Real Estate Company Owner, H.C. Plummer, Dies

Herman Charles Plummer was born January 12, 1916, in Kansas City, Kansas. He was the sixth child of eight born to Ulysses Grant and Maude Plummer. He attended Lincoln University in Jefferson City, Missouri where he received a BA Degree in Business Administration. He served in the U.S. Air Force during World War II where he was a licensed pilot.

"H.C." as he became known to his friends and associates, was always of an independent spirit and thus was committed to become self-employed. He moved to Portland, Oregon in 1948. He opened Portland's first blackowned and operated real estate company, known as H.C. Plummer & Company, Inc. He assisted and encouraged many blacks to pursuing a career in real estate and insurance. His knowledge and willingness to assist buyers and sellers alike in any area of his expertise is far reaching. For several years he served as Project Manager of the Portland Development Commission.

In addition to his involvements in his real estate and insurance business, he spent many hours with civic and community service projects. To name a few; he served on the board of directors of the Urban League of Portland and the N.A.A.C.P., President of the N.W. Bridge Association, past President of the Challengers Bridge Club, past President of the Royal Esquire Club, he held several offices in Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and he was a former candidate for state representative.


