## Help us find a balance.

One of BPA's major New Year's resolutions is to complete our 1987 Resource Strategy by spring.

The Resource Strategy is our yearly effort to balance electrical resources against future regional energy needs. What resources will be available? Which will be the least expensive?

This year's main challenge is what to do with WPPSS' nuclear power plants WNP 1 and 3: complete, terminate, or preserve?

Termination of both projects could cost us \$30 million above budget in 1988-89. It could mean spending \$2 billion more for new coal plants to replace WNP 1 and 3 if and when demand requires. (There's a 63% chance the region will need one of those two plants by 2005, and 50% chance the region will need the other. But if private utilities do not buy power from BPA, the likelihood of needing WNP 1 and 3 is much lower.)

Termination might trigger demand for immediate repayment of the \$3.7 billion in outstanding bonds which funded WNP 1 and 3... an action with unprecedented effect on our rates.

On the other hand, the economic advantages of preservation fall to zero if coal costs turn out to be lower, or costs to complete and operate WNP 1 and 3 are substantially higher than our latest estimates.

Most economic/legal studies favor preservation, but conclusions are complex and debatable. We need your suggestions.
