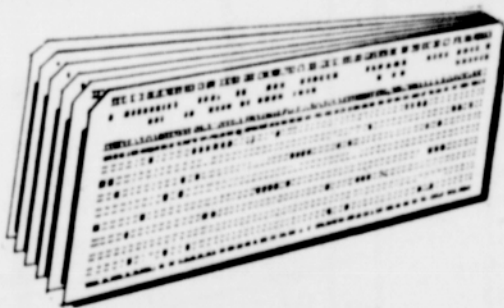
Public comment will be received at both hearings regarding the following:

- 2) Tri-Met's special needs transportation programs for senior and disabled citizens.
- 3) Tri-Met's draft fiscal year 87-88 special needs transportation budget.

The Wayne State University Library System announces three entry-level librarian vacancies in the following areas: **access services, humanities/social sciences reference, and science and engineering reference.** All three positions include participation in bibliographic instruction, collection development, and faculty liaison.
