Single Family Lease Agreement With Housing Authority of **Portland**

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Housing Authority of Portland today executed a renewable lease for a single family acquired property at a rate of \$1.00 a year. This home will be used to provide shelter for homeless families and represents one more piece in the Portland emergency assistance network.

This action is a continuation of the joint cooperation between the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, the City of Portland, and the Housing Authority to provide both housing stock and support services for homeless individuals and families. In executing the lease for HUD, Portland Manager Richard Brinck noted "Families with children are the fastest growing segment of the homeless population and that scarcity of affordable housing is the primary cause of homelessness."

This particular program being used today was established by Housing and Urban Development Secretary Pierce to use housing stock available to the federal government through the FHA mortgage insurance program. Strict limits have been placed on the housing provided to assure that this activity will in no way jeopardize the FHA mortgage insurance fund. This lease represents the first of an admittedly small program but can provide unique housing opportunities for homeless families.



PP&L Teaches Higher Math

Four Pacific Power & Light Company engineers in Portland are instructors in an innovative program that teaches higher math concepts to inner-city fourth and fifth grad

The engineers are the first corporate volunteers in a program called Project SEED, Inc., whose purpose is to pump up the self esteem of less-advantaged children through successful learning experiences in advanced mathematics.

SEED instructors use the Socratic method where questioning is used to guide students to reson answers. The students are allowed to respond in unison. Hand signals show agreement and disagreement to

"A SEED classroom is a highly energized place," said Horace Sanders, a Pacific volunteer. "Students learn quickly that it's fun to participate. It's exciting to watch class participation rise as the class progresses, especially when the kid slumped in the back row joins in,"

Math was chosen as a way of reaching out because it transcends language and cultural barriers. "Higher math is the great equalizer," said Joseph Schmidt, Project SEED coordinator in Portland. "When you are learning a new concept, such as exponentiation theory or logarithms, every student begins at the same level," Schmidt said.

SEED classes are being taught this year at Boise-Eliot, Humboldt, King, Peninsula, Sabin, Vernon, Woodlawn and Irvington elemen-

Staff and administration costs are supported by funds from the Portland School District. Pacific Power has donated the time of its engineers to train for and teach the SEED classes.

Pacific volunteers are Horace Sanders, Portland; Roland Gilchrist, Gladstone; Paul Capell, Beaverton; and Don Feltz, Portland.

'The SEED goal is to build confidence in these kids that will spill over into their daily lives. As I see their eyes light up during class, I know this program is working,


