FOR BIDS

Sealed bids for the Portland International Airport, Maintenance Facility, Vehicle Wash will be received at the office of the Purchasing Manager of The Port of Portland, 700 N.E. Multnomah Street, 12th floor, Portland, Oregon, (mailing address: Post Office Box 3529, Portland, Oregon, 97208) until, but not after, 3 p.m., March 26, 1987, and thereafter publicly opened and read.

Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Women Business Enterprise (WBE) Good-Faith-Effort Program:

Bidders are required to show that subcontractors, suppliers, and manufacturers which have been certified by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) or the City of Portland as Minority Business Enterprises or Women Business Enterprises will participate in not less than the following percentages of the total dollar amount bid:

Minority Business Enterprises (MBEs): 10%
Women Business Enterprises (WBEs): 3%

Scope:

Demolition of asphalt; supply and installation of a vehicle wash building and equipment room including foundations, pits, bollards, trenches, and slabs; supply and installation of water and drainage system including catch basin, and tie-in to existing water line and storm sewer; tie-in to existing electrical systems; supply and installation of brushless vehicle wash system including piping, pumps, tanks, electrical, lighting, and control systems.

A prebid conference will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, March 18, 1987, at the Portland Inter-

national Airport Maintenance Facility, 7111 N.E. Alderwood Road, Portland, Oregon, to discuss all phases of the work.

Bids must be on the bid form which will be provided to prospective bidders and must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check drawn on a United States bank or a bid bond payable to The Port of Portland in an amount equal to at least 10 percent of the total amount bid.

Bidders are required to prequalify. Prequalification statements must be received at least 5 days prior to the time set for bid opening. Applications for prequalification may be submitted less than 5 days before bid opening, but consideration by Port cannot be assured.

The drawings and the contract manual may be examined at Port offices. Copies may be obtained by prospective bidders upon deposit of \$20, which deposit will be refunded upon return of the drawings, contract manual, and other documents in good condition within one week after bid opening.

Attention is called to the provisions of the Oregon Revised Statutes 279.350, providing that workers be paid prevailing wage rates.

Bids may be rejected if not in compliance with bidding procedures and requirements. Any or all bids may be rejected if in the public interest to do so.
