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The Bottom Line:

Literacy in the Oregon Workplace Conference

Oregon Project Literac: U.S. (PLUS), and several Oregon businesses present a one-day business and literacy conference May 8, 1987 at the Portland Hilton Hotel. Harold W. McGraw, Jr., Chairman of the Board for McGraw-Hill, Inc., and President of the Business Council for Effective Literacy is keynote speaker.

More than 27 million adult Americans are functionally illiterate. Of those, 127,000 live and work in Oregon. "Virtually all businesses are adversely affected by illiteracy," McGraw said. If you find it hard to believe you may have staff members who can't read, he suggests you look closely. "Many of those unable to read have perfected covers for their handicap. Most are competent, resourceful individuals who suffer dearly for this setback. But we all pay a price."

Designed to help business leaders identify illiteracy and help employees overcome it, the conference features brief presentations by Oregon businessmen who have started successful literacy programs, and information on dyslexia and illiteracy. There is also testimony from employees who were once illiterate and afternoon workshops outlining techniques to beat the problem.

The Bottom Line: Literacy in the Oregon Workplace is funded by Pacific Northwest Bell, with additional support from Oregon Public Broadcasting, The MacArthur Foundation, KATU TV, Oregon Literacy Fund, The Telephone Pioneers, The Oregonian, State Advisory Committee for Adult Education and Literacy, Powell's Bookstore, Allied Daily News papers and Portland Community College.
