



Rep. Carter Moves to Fight Drug Houses in District

Representative Margaret L. Carter today announced her strong support for House Bill 3385, a bill that would allow the state to close down drug houses by taking the rental property off the market.

House Bill 3385 would "add to the existing law that already covers buildings where prostitution takes place." "Under the law proposed, the district attorney or a citizen could take action against occupants, owners, lessees or agents of a building where illegal drugs are being sold or distributed," Carter said.

"Available estimates are that there are from 100 to 300 'drug houses' in North/Northeast Portland," Carter stated. "House Bill 3385 will help to discourage such practices by individual drug peddlers, businesses or owners that knowingly provide accommodation to use of controlled substances."

"In North/Northeast Portland, this type of place has been used to encourage youths into cocaine, black tar heroin or 'crack' abuse. Many times, the individuals found at such places are first time offenders with little or no police record."

"In this legislation, we are trying to move against the early stages of drug use, abuse and illegal traffic. We are going after those that make a profit from increased addiction. We are trying to save our kids and our neighborhoods."
