Statement on Benjamin Linder Resolution

I made the statement, during my campaign for City Council, that issues of global significance . . . those over which we exercise no direct control, or that have no direct impact on our community . . . are of no official concern, to local elected officials.

I have since come to the realization, that if mayors and commissioners, in all the cities of America, large and small, had stood up and said NO! to the Vietnam War . . . perhaps there would have been no war.

America's misadventures abroad are allowed to take shape and grow . . . because we sit by, in silence, wringing our hands.

There is no need here, today, to draw parallels between Vietnam and Nicaragua. A dirty war is a dirty war.

The death of Benjamin Linder brings that war home, to Portland. And while his memory is fresh, we need to bring America home . . . to bring what we stand for into sharp focus . . . and determine what we want our nation to be.

With this resolution, we are sending a message to the world. We are standing up, and saying NO!

We are asking people everywhere to add their voice to the call for a new foreign policy . . . one that emphasizes PEACE.

HOME OWNERSHIP OPPORTUNITY


Multnomah County is pleased to announce a program that provides affordable home ownership opportunities to low to moderate income families through their Multnomah County Housing Opportunity Program (MCHOP). In order to qualify for a 2 or 3 bedroom townhouse in a 30-unit planned urban development, a family should:

- 1) Have a steady income that does not exceed 95% of the area median income. The income guidelines are adjusted according to family size. For example, a family of 4 could earn no more than \$33,700 to qualify, a family of 5, no more than \$33,700.
- 2) Not have owned a home in the past 3 years.
- 3) Have a good credit rating.
- 4) Be able to provide a down payment of approximately \$2,000.
- 5) Attend a meeting scheduled at the Multnomah Education Service District Building, 220 S.E. 102nd, Portland at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 21.

Because federally insured mortgages are available, some families may qualify for interest rates as low as 4%. Families with children will be considered first. For further information, call Sonya at 248-3648.


