

HOME OWNERSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Multnomah County is pleased to announce a program that provides affordable home ownership opportunities to low to moderate income families through their Multnomah County Housing Opportunity Program (MCHOP). In order to qualify for a 2 or 3 bedroom townhouse in a 30-unit planned urban development, a family should.

1) Have a steady income that does not exceed 95% of the area median nave a steady income that does not exceed 95% of the area median income. The income guidelines are adjusted according to family size. For example, a family of 4 could earn no more than \$31,000 to qualify; a family of 5, no more than \$33,700.

Not have owned a home in the past 3 years.


3) Have a good credit rating.
4) Be able to provide a down payment of approximately \$2,000. Attend a meeting scheduled at the Multnomah Education Service District Building, 220 S.E. 102nd, Portland at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday.
