

NOTICE TO PUBLIC

On June 1, 1987, the City of Portland will apply for \$696,000 in general funds from the U.S. Department of HUD to undertake the fourth year of the Rental Rehabilitation Program. The purpose of this program is to 1) provide loan assistance for the rehabilitation of privately owned residential rental property to be used primarily for housing low income families, and 2) to increase the availability of housing units for the use of voucher and certificate holders in the Portland area.

Federal requirements set standards of 100% benefit to lower income families; however, this standard may be reduced to 70% under certain circumstances. The City's program is intended to meet the 100% benefit standard, but to avoid instances of tenant displacement and other unforeseen conditions, the City will certify to HUD that at a minimum, 70% of program benefit will go to lower income families.

BAYLOR UNIVERSITY DIRECTOR OF THE PROGRAM FOR REGIONAL STUDIES

Newly created full-time, tenure-track position. Deadline for applications is 10 April 1987, position available on 1 June 1987.

The Program for Regional Studies, established in 1986, will eventually become an institute. It exists to study, interpret, and document subjects related to Texas both as an entity and as the point of convergence of several discrete regions which extend beyond it. Exhibits and publications will be sponsored; a major national symposium is scheduled for October, 1987. A goal is to enhance the university's curriculum through development of a regionally focused interdisciplinary academic program. A faculty Council for Regional Studies guides the program, which is budgeted separately and is under the administrative supervision of the Provost.

Minimum qualifications include an earned doctorate or completion of the highest degree in the applicant's field, and experience in a relevant discipline. Persons with interdisciplinary academic backgrounds are especially encouraged to apply. Other requirements include: qualifications to permit joint appointment in an academic department; successful teaching experience; significant scholarly research and publication; leadership skills; administrative competence, and demonstrated ability to obtain external funding. The director will be obligated to obtain external funding sufficient for the annual operation of the program. Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.
