Bogle Names Monica Little As Assistant

Monica Little, attorney with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and newly-elected member of the Portland Community College Board of Directors, has joined Portland City Commissioner Dick Bogle's staff as a commissioner's assistant.

She started work on Monday, May 18. "Monica's professional expertise, together with her knowledge of how government works, will make her a valuable member of my team from the outset," Bogle said, adding he is currently in the process of realigning staff duties.

Little, 39, has been with the Corps of Engineers for the past four years. Prior to that, she was staff attorney for Multnomah County Legal Aid's Senior Law Project, and a judicial clerk for Circuit Court Judge Robert P. Jones.

A native of Seattle, she moved to Portland in 1976, taking a job as an assistant manager analyst with the city's Bureau of Management and Budget. She had been working in Seattle as a budget analyst for King County.

She is a graduate of the University of Washington, with a bachelor's degree in Black Studies, and a master's degree in public administration. In 1980, she earned the Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from Northwestern School of Law of Lewis and Clark College, where she was named to the Cornelius Honor Society.

In 1982, she was elected to the board of directors of the Multnomah Bar Association's Young Lawyers Section. The following year, she was appointed to Portland's Police Internal Investigation Auditing Committee.

She was elected to the PCC board on March 31, replacing Dr. Howard Cherry, who had served on the board since its inception in June, 1968.

Her professional accomplishments with the Corps of Engineers led to her selection in 1985 as the Portland District's "Employee of the Year."
