**PCC Announces Dedication of New Science Lab at Cascade Campus**

Portland Community College is inviting the public to the dedication of a new state-of-the-art, multi-course science laboratory Tuesday, June 2, at PCC's Cascade Campus, 705 N. Killingsworth St.

A laboratory "showcase" from 2 to 5 p.m. will feature electronic and computer-aided instruction demonstrations, biology displays and laboratory exercises using computers. The dedication ceremony will be at 3 p.m. Refreshments will be served to visitors.

The laboratory was designed for multi-course use in Cascade's small, comprehensive campus setting, said Dale R. Burger, PCC chemistry instructor who helped plan the lab. The layout enables one instructor to oversee a number of laboratory projects from different classes in the biological and physical sciences.

The lab also was designed to serve as a study center. Computers provide instructional assistance and in actual experiments interact with student operators. Study carrels accommodate video and audio tapes, slides and 16-millimeter film loops.

Safety features include individual exhaust systems on lab tables to minimize chemical odors or fumes, a chemical preparation and storage area for safe mixing and dispensing and quick exit routes for students if unsafe conditions arise, Burger said.

The lab, which accommodates 30 students at a time, has been in use since construction and equipping were completed early this spring.
